

Key Instant Recall Facts

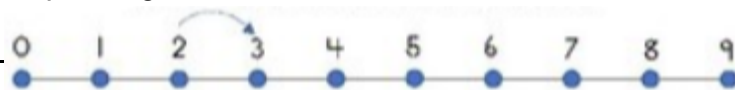
Reception – Spring 1

I can say 1 more than a given number up to 10.

By the end of this half term, children should be able to say one more than any number up to 10.

1 more than...	They might be able to record it as a calculation:
1 is 2	$0 + 1 = 1$
2 is 3	$1 + 1 = 2$
3 is 4	$2 + 1 = 3$
4 is 5	$3 + 1 = 4$
5 is 6	$4 + 1 = 5$
6 is 7	$5 + 1 = 6$
7 is 8	$6 + 1 = 7$
8 is 9	$7 + 1 = 8$
9 is 10	$8 + 1 = 9$
10 is 11	$9 + 1 = 10$
	$10 + 1 = 11$

Use a number line to hop along one more:



The aim is for them to say, "one more than 2 is 3", or you say to them. They may be able to say what would be one less too.

Top Tips

The secret to success is practising little and often. Practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey for example.
